Comprehensive Needs Assessment

Olton Junior High is a 6-8 grade campus with an enrollment of 161 students. The low income percentage is 74.1%. Olton Junior High Met the Standard for the 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 Accountability Summary.

An on-line survey was conducted for parents, students, staff, and community members. A school reach phone call was sent to parents requesting that they go on-line and complete the survey. Students were also sent to the computer lab and asked to complete the survey.

The Campus Advisory Committee (CAC) discussed and created many of the goals found within this plan. The committee discussed in detail what they thought should be in the plan and it was added.

According to a teacher survey completed at the end of the 2015-2016 school year, 60% of the OJH staff feel as though there is little to not support for the student's education. They feel as though the parents do not provide enough support for their child. In response to this survey OJH is implementing an assignment recapture program. We will be using the school messenger phone system to notify parents if their child is missing an assignment. We feel as though this will help encourage parents to be involved in their child's education as well as support the efforts of the OJH staff.

Parents indicated that they feel welcomed at OJH, they receive frequent basis and that the parent portal access given to their child has been very beneficial. Parents also fee that there is adequate parent/teacher communication. We want to continue with these programs and ideals. A goal was written goal 3 objective 1 to reinforce the parent portal program.

The Olton ISD administrative met during the summer of 2016 and determined that we needed to do more to help increase the safety for all students and staff. The crisis go program was purchased and will be used in all drills and emergencies. We also reviewed the crisis plan and made some changes. The crisis go program is included in goal objective 2.

In August of 2016 (during in-service) the teachers at OJH discussed strategies that were successful during the 2015-2016 school year. Two strategies discussed were "success day" and "STAAR Boot Camps." The teachers wanted to see "success day" implemented every day so we created a "missing assignment recapture" program that will be implemented at OJH for 2016-2017. We will also ensure that "STAAR Boot Camps" will be implemented for all STAAR subjects.

Olton Junior High is being staged for low performance in Writing, Social Studies and Science. A plan will be developed to present to the Texas Education Agency upon request

State Accountability

Olton Junior High Met the Standard for all indices. Overall, OJH increased by 20 cumulative points for the indices. OJH also increased (all students) STARR scores cumulatively by 43%.
